

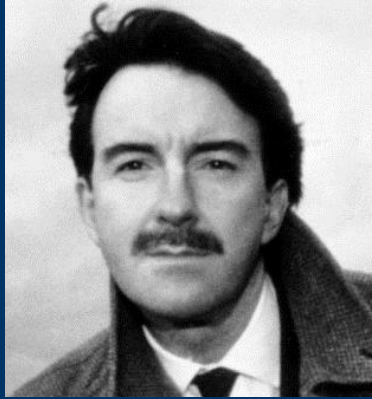
Nation's Favourite Poem - answers

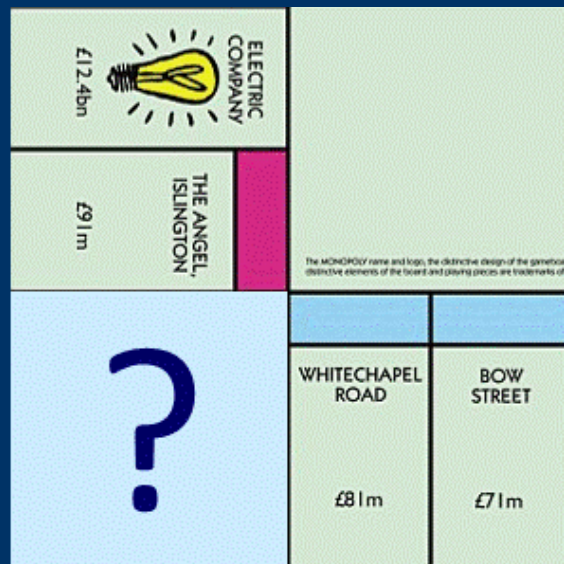

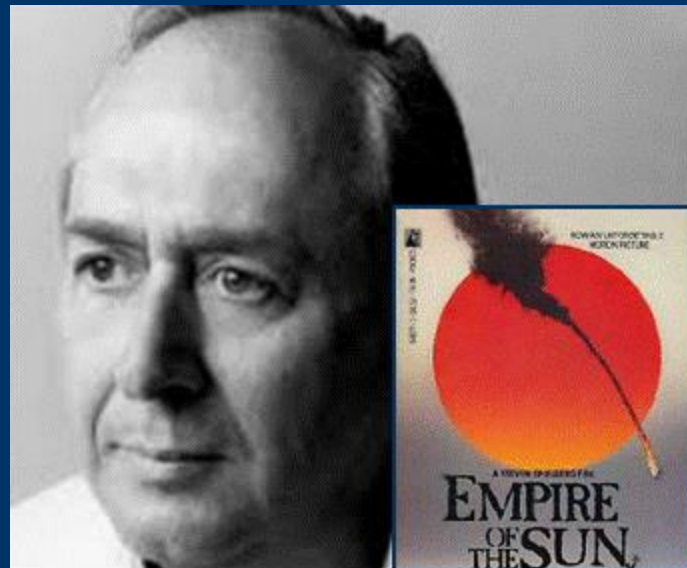

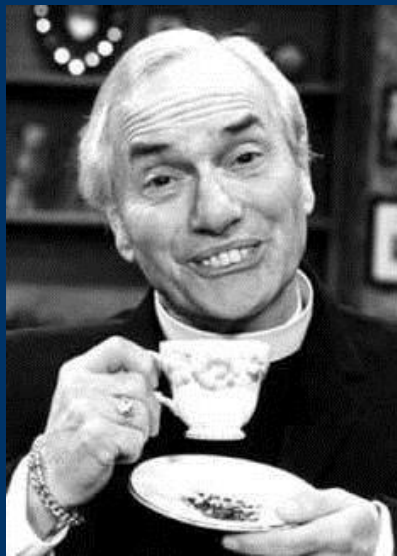

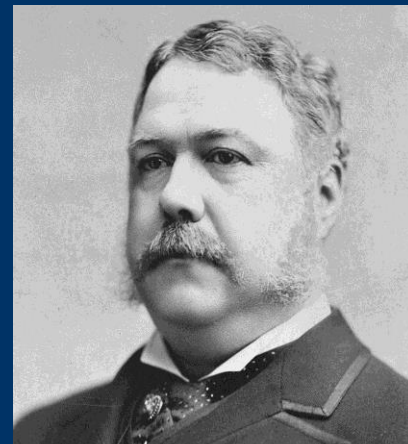
